Pre-Registration or Early Registration events:

CTE-Career Transition Coordinators can advise both parents and students on potential high school courses that college credit is granted for before it is too late. Finding out early the scope and sequence of classes necessary to earn the college credit is a critical factor because many students find out too late and cannot complete the required pathways in time before graduation to be eligible for the credits.

Financial Aid events:

CTE-Career Transition Coordinators have the opportunity to promote college cost savings by not having to take out so many student loans by purchasing the college credits earlier while still in high school. Coordinators can show both parents and students how they may have already have saved themselves a significant amount of money just by participating in Technical Competency course through (CTE) Career Technical Education programs.

College Fair events:

CTE-Career Transition Coordinators can advise students on which Technical colleges are offering which Technical Competency Credit courses at which high schools so they can choose which classes they want to sign up for that leads to a particular career pathway or degree.

This is a great day to speak with just the Freshman and make them aware of the CTE pathways and sequence of classes they need to take that will lead them to eligibility for Technical Competency Credit while still in high school before it is too late to take the required full sequence of classes necessary to get the credit as well as how to go about purchasing and transcript those credits within the allotted time frame before they expire
